Jim, Nino Arseno and I enlisted in the Army after graduating from various colleges and were processed in at the Cleveland, OH Recruitment Center. We went to Basic Training, Advanced Individual Training (OCS Prep) and then OCS together. We spent a lot of time together since we came from similar backgrounds. After graduation and 10 months in the US I went to Korea and then to Viet Nam. Jim served in the 1/77th FA and later on I did also. Over the years I have often thought of Jim and remember him as a great guy.
