## BIOGRAPHY OF COLONEL DOUGLAS E. WARNE

Colonel Douglas E. Warne, a native of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, was commissioned in Field Artillery upon graduation of Officers Candidate School in 1970. He completed Command and General Staff College in 1985. Colonel Warne was then assigned to the United States Atlantic Command, Norfolk, Virginia, as the Director of Operations Security. In 1988, he returned to the 2nd Infantry Division as the Executive Officer, Aviation Brigade, Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 2nd Aviation Regiment and the Deputy Aviation Officer, Eight United States Army. He returned to Tennessee where he served as the Senior Army Adviser for the 125th Army Reserve command in Nashville. In March 1995, Colonel Warne was then assigned as the Senior Army Adviser to the Tennessee Army National Guard. He was graduated from the U.S. Army War College in 1994. He is married to the former Sara Beth Walker of Clinton, Tennessee, who is a Department Chair with the O'More College of Design in Franklin. They have two children, Josh, a senior and Emily, a freshman at Christian Brother University in Memphis. His awards include the Legion of Merit, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Meritorious Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, the Air Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, the Air Assault Badge and the Senior Aviator Badge.
