Woodrow W. Wiltse was born in Saginaw, Michigan, 28 January 1918. He graduated from Michigan State University with a Bachelor of Science Degree (Police Administration) in 1943. His military career began 13 March 1943, as a Private while he was still in the ROTC program. He attended Officer's Candidate School at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, where he was commissioned a second lieutenant of Field Artillery on 9 December 1943. His first assignment was at Camp Phillips, Kansas, with the 310th Field Artillery Battalion, 79th Infantry Division. He went overseas with the 79th Infantry Division and stayed with the Division participating in the Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Central Europe and the Ardennes - Alsace Campaigns.

In December of 1945, he was released from active duty and made his home in Dearborn, Michigan. From 1945 till 1950 he was active in the Michigan National Guard until he was recalled to active duty in January 1951.

During the period January 1951 - January 1952, at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, he fulfilled various battalion command and staff positions in the 979th Field Artillery and 235th Field Artillery Observation Battalions. He also served as Executive Officer of the 130th Field Artillery Group. In January, 1952, he departed CONUS for Europe with the 979th Field Artillery Battalion which was attached to the 18th Field Artillery Group where he subsequently served as S-3 and Executive Officer. He remained with the organization until November 1954 when he returned to CONUS to attend the Associate Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas while enroute to Fort Sill, Oklahoma. At Fort Sill he served as instructor in the Department of Tactics and Combined Arms until January 1958.

In February 1958, Colonel Wiltse attended the Strategic Intelligence School, Washington, D. C. which was followed by attendance at the Army Language School where he studied French in preparation for his next assignment as Senior Assistant Army Attache in Saigon, Vietnam, where he served from January 1959 to December 1960. He returned to CONUS and was assigned to Army General Staff with duty with Office, Chief Research and Development. Here he performed duties as a staff officer and branch chief in the Policy Division under the Director of Plans and Programs. He served in this capacity until January 1964 when he was assigned to the 1st Cavalry Division in Korea. While in Korea he was Executive Officer of the 1st Cavalry Division Artillery.

In April 1965, Colonel Wiltse was assigned to the University of Oklahoma as Professor of Military Science.
