#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Colonel Wolfgang entered the Army as an enlisted Infantryman on 18 August 1953 and was stationed at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. In January 1955 he was commissioned a 2LT of Artillery following completion of OCS and was assigned to the 11th Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. He served with this Division for four years (including three years in Germany) in various field artillery battery and battalion positions. Upon his return to CONUS he was assigned to the 82d Airborne Division where he served as a battery executive officer and a battery commander. In 1961 COL Wolfgang returned to Germany following completion of the Artillery Career Course where he served first as a battery commander and later as S-3 in an 8 inch artillery battalion, for some three years.

Upon his return to CONUS, he was stationed in Portland, Oregon as a National Guard advisor. Following his promotion to Major in October 1965 he was assigned to the Republic of Vietnam as a District Advisor. Returning to CONUS in 1967 he attended the Command and General Staff College. Upon graduation he reported for duty to the Army General Staff, where he served first as an action officer and later as Chief, Policies and Programs Branch, RUO Division, ODCSPER, DA.

Returning to Vietnam in 1971 he served first as Battalion Commander, 6th Bn, 27th Artillery and later as Deputy Senior Advisor, 5th ARVN Infantry Division. In March 1972, COL Wolfgang returned to the 82d Airborne Division where he served as the DivArty executive officer until June 1973. He attended the Army War College in 1973 - 74 and concurrently received his MPA degree from Pennsylvania State University. Arriving at Fort Campbell, KY in July 1974 he served as the Division Artillery executive officer until he assumed command of the 2d Bn, 320th FA on 6 January 1975. On 1 June 1976 he concurrently relinquished command of the battalion and was promoted to Colonel. On 10 June 1976 he moved to Fort Benning, Georgia and assumed his present position of Director, Combat Support and Maintenance Department, United States Army Infantry School.
